# All fees are non-refundable\* and are payable on October 28, 2017. All applicants must sign a waiver form during registration.

Additional Information: The seminar and shinsa will be conducted according to the Zen Nippon Kendo Renmei (ZNKR) and AUSKF standards on seitei iaido. All participants must be familiar with the ZNKR seitei iaido kata (ZenKenRen iai). Shinsa candidates must attend the seminars. Due to safety reasons, shinken (swords with a sharp edge) will not be allowed. All equipment must be in good working order and will be subject to inspection at any time.

All shinsa applicants must provide the following:

1) Completed and signed application form; additionally, candidates from outside the SCKF must complete the AUSKF 'Affiliate Organization Exam Request' form.

- 2) Copy of menjo stating current rank, except for those with no rank.
- 3) Written test, if attempting 1 kyu or 1 dan only.

4) Shinsa fee: \$20 for attempting kyu; \$30 for attempting 1 dan; check payable to

- Southern California Kendo Federation
- 5) Menjo fee (see below) check payable to
- All United States Kendo Federation

\*Those who do not pass their shinsa will have their menjo fees returned.

- 3. Why are you studying laido? What do you hope to accomplish?


# **Shodan Candidates**
